bark up the wrong tree	look in the wrong place or falsely accuse	He asked me if I broke his laptop. I said he was barking up the wrong tree.
beast of burden	someone carries another person's problems	I will never be your beast of burden. You have got to deal with your own problems.
beat a dead horse	dwell on a topic beyond resolution	I told you several times that I won't do it. Don't beat a dead horse!
black sheep	unaccepted group member	Tom was the black sheep of the family and preferred to do things on his own.


