

ESL Reading Activities

for

Kids and Adults

Newspaper Articles

Objective: Enhance reading comprehension skills by analyzing newspaper articles and identifying key information.

Level: Intermediate to Advanced

Duration: 60-90 minutes

Materials Needed

- Copies of a local newspaper or access to an online newspaper
- Worksheet with questions related to newspaper articles

Teaching Outline
